Short description of the Heritage, (preferably within 350 words)

Mangal Shobhajatra is a mass procession that takes place at the first day of the Bengali New Year in Bangladesh. The procession is organised by the teachers and students of the Faculty of Fine Arts, University of Dhaka. This celebration is considered an expression of the secular uniqueness of the Bangladeshi people. It was declared an Intangible Cultural Heritage by UNESCO in 2016. The procession was first started in Jashore on Pohela Boishak in 1985. The aim was that to unite all the people by presenting the folk culture of the country. It was initiated by Artist Mahbub Jamal Shamim. The procession of the festival was first observed in 1989 from Charukala in Dhaka on Pohela Boishak. In the beginning, It was called 'Ananda Shovajatra'. Later it came to be known as 'Mangal Shobhajatra'. Every year, thousands of people take part in the procession that features gigantic replicas of birds, fish, animals, folk tale and other motifs. The rally

symbolizes unity, peace, and the driving away of evil to allow progress of country and humanity. In 2014, the Bangla Academy compiled a nomination file that was approved by the Ministry of Cultural Affairs of Bangladesh and submitted to UNESCO.
