

Tepa putul

The potters of Bengal make these putuls by pressing soft clay through hand craft and technical know-how. This putul is called tapa putul made by hand pressing.

Tepa putuls are also a part of Bengali tradition. Tepa putuls are mainly made by women in Bangladesh. But now men are also getting involved in this work. The craftsman has to apply his own talent and skills to make these putuls. The putul's limbs are built by hand. The putul's ornaments and clothes are revealed by drawing a line of a stick or a stick of clay. It is then allowed to dry in the sun. After drying, it is burned in fire. This is how Tepa putuls are made.

Tapa putuls are usually made as children's toys. Some notable toy putuls are bride and groom, farmer, wife wearing nath. Hobbyists decorate these putuls for home decoration. Tepa puppets are arranged in village fairs. Currently, this putul can be seen in urban fairs.
